Contract bid documents and plans were approved by the Tennessee Department of Transportation on June 17, 2010. The State is currently reviewing our soft match (Architect Fees). When we have final authority to proceed to construction; we expect to have the work completed within 180 days.

With great sadness, we report the passing of Judith “Judy” Owings Wassom, Heritage Commission board member and her husband Stan Wassom. Both were interested and worked hard to promote and preserve Rockwood and Roane County’s history. Judy, a native of Roane County and the daughter of Zola and Tom Owings, she died April 11, 2010. She was very active in Rockwood 2000 and opened her home to the Rockwood Christmas Home Tour. She was in her 45th year of teaching at Roane County High.

Her husband of 46 years, Stan Wassom died on Feb. 21, 2010. He had helped Judy in the Christmas home tour portraying Union General John T. Wilder, one of the founders of Rockwood. He was elected to the Rockwood City Council in 2009 and at his death, Judy was named to the City Council.

They leave a daughter, Zoe, and four grandchildren.

John Crawford Vaughn (continued from last issue)

John Crawford Vaughn was a Captain in the 5th Tennessee Infantry during the Mexican War and he organized and commanded of the 3rd Tennessee Infantry CSA. Vaughn's first action was the first Battle of Manassas and he was soon promoted to Brigadier General. Later in the war, he was captured at Vicksburg on July 4, 1863. He then commanded a cavalry brigade in the Shenandoah Valley. Vaughn was prominently known enough to be requested to escort President Jefferson Davis on his escape from Richmond in 1865. He was also nominated as a speaker of Tennessee Senate in 1871. Vaughn was a former Tennessee merchant before his military career. After all of his amazing accomplishments,

he passed away peacefully on September 10, 1875 at his home in Thomasville, GA. He is buried there with his second wife Florence L. Jones Vaughn.

There is much more information on John Crawford Vaughn in the archives files and library. The amazement of his military abilities and career seem to never end, and his life is full of details of the time period that was so full of dramatic events. The Civil War in itself was a tragic but memorable time period that we each carry in our family trees. John Crawford Vaughn was a hero in his own time and his information should be passed down to each of our future generations.
